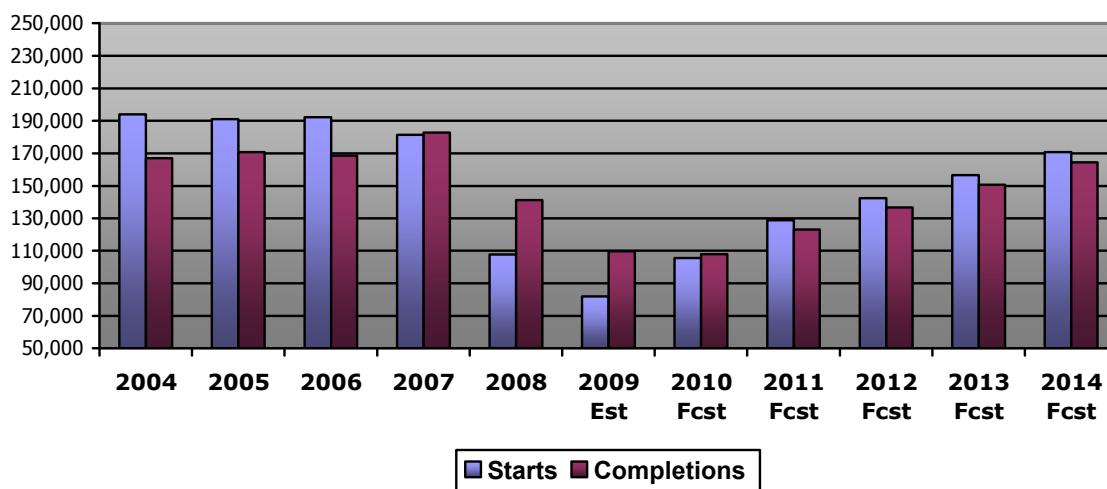
### Content
